Further In is almost a solo for two instruments: here virtuosity is the individual control in the tightened joint of the instruments, always onward, aiming to the fusion with the other in order to become one thing, inseparable.

Further In is a closed form tending to a circular one. There is not a real development but rather a juxtaposition of slow micro variations of materials that always reappear, shoring up lines and space, towards a release, a stasis on hold, pulsating. It's a gait, a *Wandern* without climax which nevertheless contains a strong vectoriality towards something mysterious, so far away and so close. Born in Rome, currently living in Amsterdam.

Graduated in piano and composition, Borzelli studied in Italy and abroad with composers such as Brian Ferneyhough, Luca Francesconi, Beat Furrer, Bernhard Lang, Yannis Kyriakides and Francesco Filidei.

Philippe Wurtz, Jurjen Hempel in festivals such as Venice Music Biennale, Nuova Consonanza (Rome), Festival Rondò (Milan), Voix Nouvelles (Royaumont), Festival Musica (Strasbourg), Contempuls Festival (Prague), Holland Festival, Gaudeamus Muziekweek (Amsterdam), ISCM World New Music Days, Wien Modern (Vienna).
