DESCRIPTION

Robotron for ensemble and sampler

The title of this piece is directly related to the East German electronics manufacturer. The GDR government spent enormous amounts on products that enabled a huge amount of information regarding almost every aspect of its citizens' daily life to be collected.

At the same time, the pioneers of electronic music were working underground on avant-garde instruments, struggling with limited resources. That disparity between the artist and authoritarian power formed the starting point for this composition. Referring to the phenomenon of *Ostalgie* and modern attempts to reconstruct the sound of the lost instruments, I tried to create the specific situation of a sonic experiment in which the most crucial sound generator is a human, not a machine. The key relationship in this piece is that between the dehumanised tape voice and the musicians, who, by dividing into groups, create a virtual synthesiser.

COMPOSER

Paweł Malinowski

Born in 1994, Paweł Malinowski is mainly interested in reworking existing musical material in different contexts, camp aesthetics and ordinary stories about daily life. He won the Grand Prix at the 58th Tadeusz Baird Young Composers Competition (2017), and in December 2017 he was awarded the prize of the Polish Ministry of Culture and National Heritage for the best students.

He has been working with various leading new music ensembles, including Airborne Extended (AT), CORda Cracovia Orchestra (PL), Friction Quartet (US), Hashtag Ensemble (PL), Momenta Quartet (US), NJYD (DK) and Spółdzielnia Muzyczna contemporary ensemble (PL). His works have been performed at festivals such as Sacrum Profanum (Cracow), Ferienkurse für Neue Musik (Darmstadt), Wawel at Dusk (Cracow), Warsaw Music Encounters, Panorama (Aarhus), Pulsar (Copenhagen), Ostrava Days, Örebro Contemporary Music Festival and Musica Electronica Nova (Wroclaw).

He is currently pursuing a Master's programme in composition with Prof. Wojciech Widłak at Cracow Music Academy and Juliana Hodkinson, Niels Rønsholdt and Simon Steen-Andersen at the Royal Academy of Music, Aarhus. He has taken part in workshops and masterclasses led by Eivind Buene, Pierluigi Billone, Bernhard Lang, Stefan Prins, Kaija Saariaho, Marco Stroppa, Jennifer Walshe and others.
